Message from Academic Advisor, SVIS


Education without values, as useful as it is, seems rather to make man a more clever devil. - *C.S.Lewis*

School Updates

- The school was started with classes up to Grade 7, as per the plan. Curriculum is designed to include academic and co-curricular activities. Sadacharam, Yoga, Art, Sanskrit and Classical Dance were introduced alongside academics from the beginning and they are being pursued earnestly by students of all grades.
- Qualified and well-trained teachers were recruited. They were oriented on the lines of Saradadhamam philosophy and pedagogy to build competence and team spirit.
- Despite the constraints during the Pandemic, school strength has consistently increased in number. By word of mouth, the good work of the school is spread across the neighborhood and the nearby areas.
- New joinees are accommodated in the regular classes and extra hours of teaching, personal guidance and care by the teachers is given to ensure that they don't feel left out.
- Since 2nd week of June, online classes are being conducted for classes L.K.G to Grade 7 with varied timings and duration.
- Teachers are given necessary training in using technology and through determination and practice they have now become very familiar with digital teaching. Student attendance and participation has always been nearly 100% on all days.
- As per the C.B.S.E assessment pattern, Formative Assessments 1, 2 & 3 were completed in July, August & December respectively and Summative Assessment-I was conducted in October. The first term has come to an end on 16th October.

Parent Orientations

Sri Vidyaranya International School believes in partnering with parents to create the best schooling experiences for its students in an endeavour to expound the School's Philosophy & Vision, pedagogical practices and the curriculum. We have conducted the 1st parent meeting on 5th March, 2020. Teachers were introduced formally and FAQ's of parents were addressed. The session gave parents, the much-needed clarity and confidence to make the big decision.

On 25th and 26th of July, the 2nd PTM was conducted. Guidelines and expectations for online classes were explained and parents' opinions and concerns were discussed. Further, the online class schedule was redesigned taking the parents inputs into consideration.

C.B.S.E Term End Assessment pattern, schedule and guidelines were discussed during the 3rd PTM on the 26th and 27th of September. Sample papers with the blue print, answer key and the marking scheme were discussed. The revision classes enabled the students to get well prepared for the assessments.

On 7th of October, the 4th PTM was conducted to discuss Term-I results followed by a Google survey to take the feedback from the parents on School's performance. Parents' feedback was delightful and encouraging.

On 2nd January, the 5th PTM was conducted and parents' feedback was noted to create individualised action plan. Childwise result analysis was done for remediation through one on one sessions.

Teacher's Training and Workshops

Workshop on 'Blooms Taxonomy and Learning Outcomes' was conducted by Academic Advisor of Sri Vidyaranya International School, Smt. Sree Devi, in the months of March and April.

Teacher training in Vidyapeetham philosophy is ongoing since the inception of the academic year on alternate Saturdays. Various modules on 'Pancha Koshas' and the need to align the teaching methodology for their enrichment - were conducted. Our School Teachers are being trained through these modules to design the curricular and co-curricular activities to include the practices that help in the refinement of Pancha Koshas.

First workshop of the Vidyapeetham training series on 'Incorporation of Moral and Spiritual Values (Sadacharam)' into Curriculum was conducted by Sri Ayachitula Lakshmana Rao, Dakshina Madhya Kshetra Secretary of Vidya Bharathi, on 17th October.
